Despite a difficult storage year and a thin skin potato variety, a Norfolk store has received exceptional bonuses for VR 808. Andrew Wace of Wace Partners says "VR 808 from the 2011 crop stored very well for nine months and suffered no store losses".

VR808 were unloaded in early July 2012 looking good and consistently achieving high bonuses from Walkers. Over 400 tons came out of the store, achieving an average bonus equivalent to an extra three and a half tons per Hectare.

"I was extremely pleased that the store was able to keep the VR808 variety so well for so long, considering they are thin skinned and can be tricky."

"The store has performed very well, it cures crop quickly, the last of this years potatoes put in were wet with more mud on them than was acceptable, but they were dry and ready for gassing a week after lifting finally finished. This is due to being able to control and direct large amounts of airflow accurately to where it was needed by partly shutting the laterals where the potatoes were cured and already gassed, and opening fully where the air was needed."

The store was completed 2010 with a full project management service, including special measures for planning. Being situated close to private dwellings out in open countryside, it features a low double apex roof, a profile that is sunk one and a half meters into the hill and also banded to be less conspicuous together with low level noise features.
